The meaning of the name is directly linked to its mission: in the process of reaching out to help the most destitute populations, BASSMA aims to transform hopelessness into smiles.

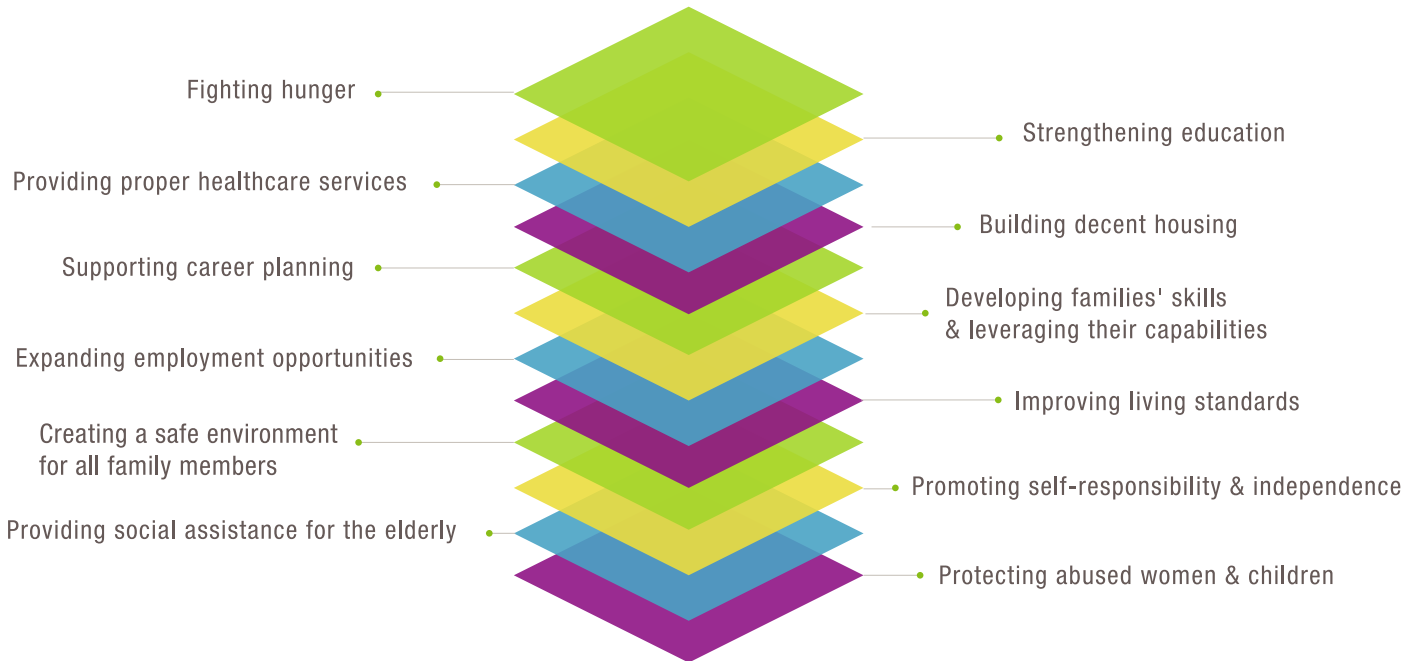


## OUR VISION

### 03 FAMILY SOCIAL INTEGRATION

- . . . BASSMA provides Mental Healthcare services including a personalized psychological follow-up to help family members get over many traumas caused by poverty, **helping them reach psychological autonomy, and achieve Social Reintegration.**

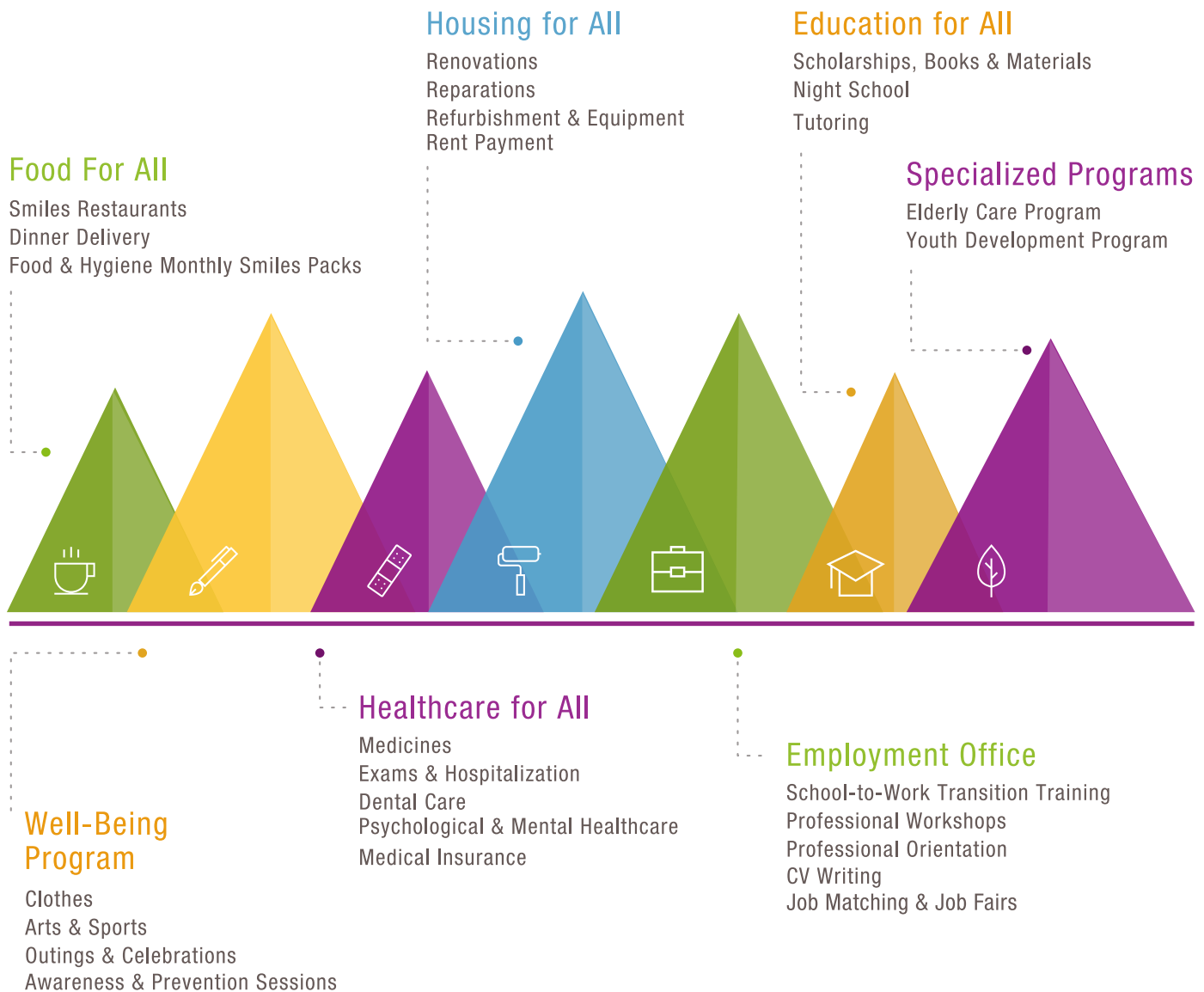
### 04 FAMILY EMPOWERMENT

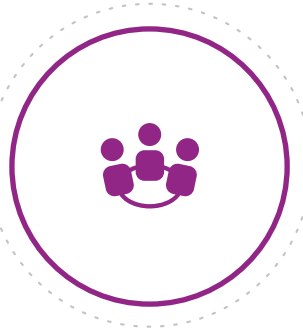

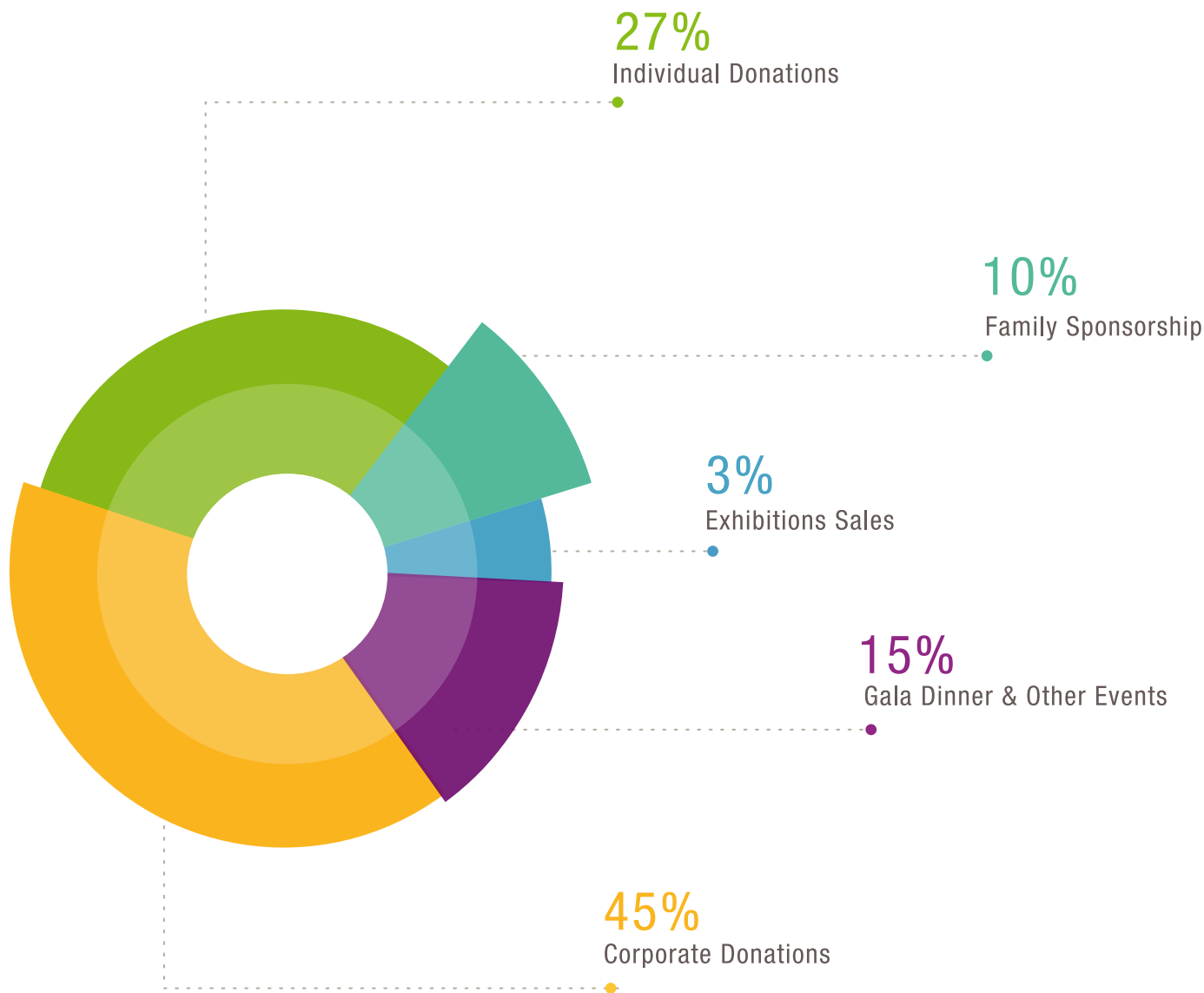

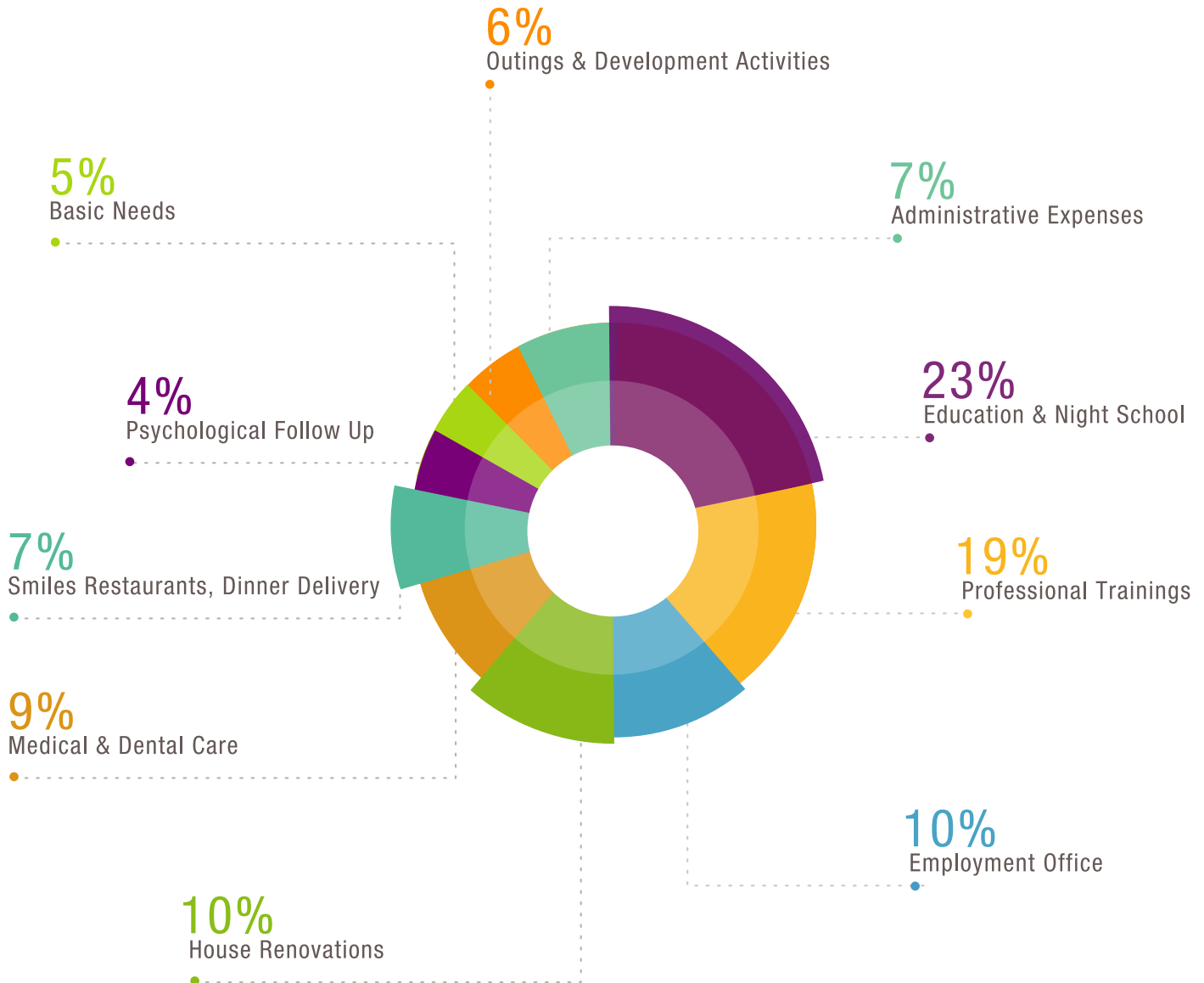


## BASSMA WINS PRIZE OF EXCELLENCE IN THE BEST IDEALISTIC NGO AWARD

Under the patronage of the Ministry of Social Affairs, Ministry of Interior & Municipalities, UNDP and in collaboration with the General Directorate of NGOs, Quality Systems International-Paris (QSI) has organized the “Best Idealistic NGO – 2015” in order to recognize and assess Lebanese NGOs based on International Quality Standards. The committee of assessment included many international and regional experts from different Ministries. This award is considered to be one of its kind in Lebanon and the region, aiming to develop the civil society sector in order to meet quality, credibility, effectiveness and transparency in Social Responsibility. 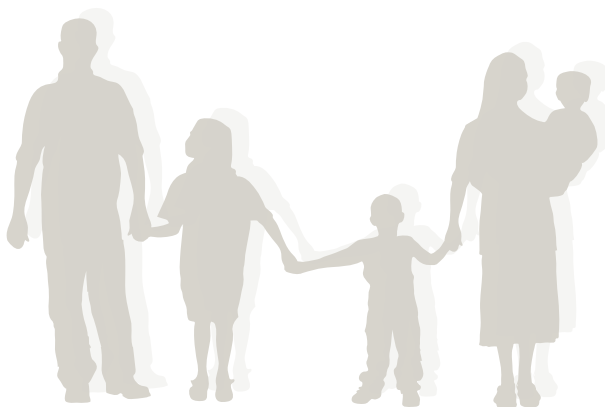
## 11 EXPENSES



Since 2002, BASSMA recruits destitute families under its Empowerment Program. The most deprived families in greater Beirut are targeted: those with limited to no income, children in public schools, not enough food on the table, homes in need of renovation, and days in need of hope. When a family is referred to BASSMA, the association team visits them in the comfort of their own home to evaluate the family's abilities, needs, and poverty level, as well as the extent to which they can benefit from BASSMA's all-inclusive Rehabilitation Program.

Each year, 200 families and other individuals, from babies, children, adults, to elderly, benefit from the following:

MY NAME IS  
SUZANNE,  
I'M 38 YEAR  
OLD, AND THE  
MOTHER  
OF 3  
TEENAGERS



In 2008, when my third boy was still a toddler, my husband abandoned the family home. I was suddenly left on my own, without any resources, helpless, and unable to find a job. My children were all sick and bedridden because of the cold weather. The rain was falling inside my rooftop house, and water was filling the ground of the entire house. My eldest boy was also suffering from epilepsy as a result of violence and bad treatment inflicted by his father before his departure. The four of us were also suffering from rough anemia, as we hardly had one meal per day, one of little nutritious value. In despair, I knocked on BASSMA's door. The answer came in no time: we soon received monthly packs of food and hygienic products, in addition to extra chicken and meat to provide the children with nutritious meals. Clothes were given to all the family members and from then on, systematically at the beginning of every season. BASSMA also provided us with vitamins, antibiotics, etc. and dental healthcare. BASSMA paid the tuition fees for the three children, in addition to all related expenses (books, uniforms, materials, school bus...) through its Education Program.

We also received BASSMA volunteers who rehabilitated and painted our apartment, fixed the ceiling holes and offered us two carpets, sofas, beds, heater, fridge and gas stove, under the Housing Program.

BASSMA also found a job for me as a cleaner. As I was starting to get back on my feet, I was diagnosed with breast cancer. Once again BASSMA stood by my side and financed all my treatments, including MRI, biopsies and chemotherapy. Thankfully, I resumed work as a cleaner, but just as things were settling in, fate sent me three unexpected surprises simultaneously. First I received an order to vacate the tiny two-room apartment we were renting in Ain El Remmaneh. Around that time, I learnt that cancer recurred, in my back this time. And the third bad news was that I had brittle bones in my feet causing me severe pain and preventing me from working... I needed so much help! I needed to keep my family together. I needed to stay on my feet to meet their needs!"

BASSMA never abandons its family members. For the second time, all the medical treatments of Suzanne were funded by [BASSMA'S Healthcare Program](#), which also paid the monthly rent and allowed the family to keep its apartment.

Today, Suzanne is back on her feet. Thanks to BASSMA, she was able to find a job as a cook assistant in a restaurant and is able to support her family by herself. The two eldest children have grown up and work to help their family. They even managed to register their mother with Social Security! The third child is a brilliant graphic designer student finalizing her university studies! And the family is finally able to shape a more smiling future



Born to an absent father and a restless and depressive mother, in a very poor neighbourhood of Borj Hammoud, Hrant and Arpi did not have much to expect from life. But in 2002, they joined BASSMA'S family with their mother. The family was taken care of at all levels: the children were finally able to go to school, eat their fill, have their mother treated by a psychiatrist, and Hrant even travelled to France in the context of an exchange program put in place by BASSMA. The two adolescents who could have been led into delinquency, like others around them, finally found a **role model** in all respects. Today, Hrant has decided to volunteer with BASSMA as a token of his appreciation, and he is even studying at the university to become a professional social worker and help others, while Arpi still goes to school.

## THERE IS ALWAYS SOMETHING TO BE THANKFUL FOR

Abandoned by his father at a young age, Bob grew up in a context of extreme poverty and was not even accepted in schools as he did not hold a Lebanese ID card. Until one day, Bob and his mother were introduced to BASSMA. With the help of a lawyer, Bob and his mother's identification papers were processed and Bob finally joined school where, according to school reports delivered to BASSMA, he was a brilliant student.

**BASSMA Employment Office** also trained Bob's mother and found a job for her as a saleswoman at a local prestigious firm, while the family benefitted from the usual , **all-Inclusive Support Package**.

Bob always dreamt of being a famous designer. BASSMA therefore found the appropriate university for him, paid half the fees and arranged a part-time job for him to finance the other half. The dedicated student turned out to be a very talented designer and he is now working, thanks to **BASSMA Employment Office**, at Elie Saab workshop.

Today, Bob has a bright future ahead of him, while his mother re-married and is the happy mother of a little girl.

The first family that was taken care of by BASSMA is probably today one of its most successful.

This is the story of four brothers: Charbel, Marwan, Georges and Milad, who were abandoned by their father and left alone with a penniless and unemployed mother. In 2002, BASSMA met the four vagrant and hungry boys with their mother in a war-torn building, in an apartment which hardly had any walls. BASSMA immediately placed Charbel, a mentally disabled child, at Kafaat, found a job to the mother at a local bakery and paid the school fees as well as tutoring classes for the three boys through the [Night School Program](#). University studies followed, and [BASSMA Employment Office](#) afterwards placed the three youths as waiters in a sushi restaurant.

After a long period of multi-faceted support, Marwan is today a priest, Charbel is still at Kafaat where he made a lot of progress, while Georges and Milad have opened their own sushi restaurant in Rawda. Success was just around the corner, which allowed the two hard-working brothers to open a second restaurant in Jounieh as of lately.

Today, the family has not only managed to break the cycle of poverty that once was its destiny, but it is one of these families that achieve great projects and lead a comfortable life.

Life with BASSMA is full of surprises. During BASSMA Gala Dinner on the occasion of its tenth anniversary, the team was thrilled to meet one of its former family members, Elie, as the prominent waiters' manager of the caterer that night. Always grateful to the organization that took care of his family in the difficult days, Elie is in regular contact with BASSMA and offers job positions at his company to all the members of BASSMA's family.



BASSMA ORGANIZES A CLOSURE CEREMONY TO CELEBRATE ITS NIGHT SCHOOL PROGRAM FOR THE YEAR 2017-2018 IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TOUCH LEBANON

The ceremony was held on the 13th of March 2018 under the patronage of Lebanon's Minister of Telecommunication H.E. Jamal Jarrah and in the presence of a representative of Minister of Social Affaires H.E. Pierre BouAssi, celebrating Bassma's "Education for All" Program joining forces with Positive Touch Program to provide full academic support and moral incentives to children.

The Night School's main objective is to fill the academic gaps of impoverished children struggling at their public schools, enhance their skills and capacities, and raise healthy minds to help them overcome the social circumstances and school drop that can have a devastating impact on their lives.

It provides the kids from 7th, 8th and 9th grades with a secure and healthy environment place to study in, nutritious snacks, all needed materials, psychological follow-up, in addition to transportation to and from the Night School premises in Ain el Remmaneh; giving them the right tools to study and concentrate with the best teachers from renown private schools, hence ensuring participation and success on official exams.

**The success rate this year was of 95 % overall, including the Official Exam!**

Parents and students are all grateful for the opportunity Bassma is providing: individual follow-ups, small number of students per class, academic seriousness and high level, and above all, the chance to have free private tutoring covering all main topics.

Bassma's Night School Program is indeed a great chance for all our youths and a real hope to shape a better future of our Lebanese society.

When I first went through the different action plans of BASSMA, I was surprised by the amount of work and the number of projects that are going on, all in parallel and at the same time.

The “Resto Sourire”, the Food Collection, the Food Packing and Distribution, the follow up with BASSMA’s families and so many other details that are time and energy consuming. The intriguing part is that during my work in the management field, my original field of expertise, I was constantly faced with problems of lack of motivation, skipping deadlines, non-cooperation and other factors, that are totally human and can be present in any kind of job. Whereas, at BASSMA, I didn’t hear any of those comments that I used to deal with on daily basis at work. Everybody is energetic, positive and ready to help. People show up on time and projects are done within deadlines.

Volunteers, school students, scouts, employees, managers, doctors, even organizations like private schools, hospitals, clinics and others. Those people lead busy lives and are engaged with their own work and studies, but they somehow found a way to help (by giving their time, experience, know-how, or whatever they are willing to do). People are willing to help and there is always something that can be done. Amazingly, BASSMA has organized a chain between all of those groups of people in order to fulfill the needs of the deprived community, which is BASSMA’s main mission”.

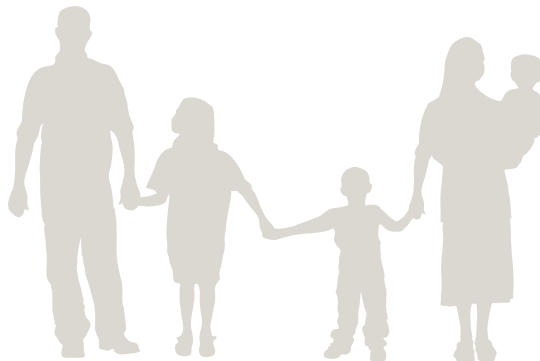
